Tips for Better Skiing

As I was scanning the internet, I happened across an article by Lisa Densmore that had quite a bit of useful information. It reinforces all the reminders that your instructors have tried to instill into your knowledge base. Skiing should be enjoyable. It helps tone your legs, boost strength and increases your anaerobic capacity.

Some points that Lisa brings out in her article "Ski Like a Pro" include items such as:

- Relax your Toes-this helps the joints in your entire lower body stay loose, ready to absorb variations in terrain.
- Flex Your Ankles-bend forward at the ankles, rather than the knees. If your ankles flex forward, your knees automatically bend to help you balance over your skis.
- Keep Your Shins Against the Tongues of your Boots-leaning back makes it difficult to turn. If your shins stay in contact with your boot tongues, your weight stays centered and you have better control.
- Put Pressure on Your Ski Tips to Start a Turn-Resist slamming all your weight to the middle of your skis at the beginning of the turn causing them to chatter. Steer your tips into the turn first, and then let your feet follow.
- Roll Your Skis from Edge to Edge-a flat ski with a wide tip is more likely to get tossed around by chunky snow and bumps. When you finish a turn, rather than flattening your skis before starting the next curve, roll your skis immediately into the new turn. Makes your technique more fluid and improves control on ice.
- Keep Your Skis Parallel-common mistake is to start a turn and hold the downhill ski on edge while allowing the uphill ski to go flat. Both skis should enter each turn and roll on edge simultaneously.
- Keep Your Hands Forward-(how many times have you heard this one!)-If your hands drop by your sides or if you allow a hand to cross over your skis, your skis will skid rather than carve. Your hands should be comfortably forward, as if holding a tray. (Sound familiar?)
- Plant Your Pole Down the Hill-As you finish a turn, plant your pole with the downhill hand helping you navigate the steeps and putting rhythm in your turns.
- Stay Centered in Powder-most skis are wider today, providing better buoyancy so we do not have to sit back on the skis to get our tips up. By remaining centered and equally weighting both skis, you will float through the fluff with less leg-burn.
- Look Ahead, Not at Your Skis- plan a path and look in front of you, not at the ground. You will have more time to react and this will also help keep your torso oriented downhill.

Many of us have heard these things many times over and over. One thing that helps me is repeating to myself to "keep my hands forward" as I am skiing downhill because often times I forget to do this. As we go out on the slopes this season, continue to work on these tips. It makes us better skiers. When we get in difficult situations, we revert back to techniques that are opposite of the skills we need to get out of those predicaments. Practicing these items on the easy blue and green slopes, will make those black diamonds look easy.

Have a great ski season wherever you travel. Relax and enjoy the adventure!

OMAHA SKI CLUB TRIP POLICIES

- 1) Trip captain is the final authority on and during the trip.
- 2) Club members will conduct themselves in a mature manner at all times.
- 3) There will be a \$28.00 charge on any returned check.

TRIP SIGN-UP, DEPOSITS AND PAYMENTS

- 4) Only members in good standing with dues currently paid to the Omaha Ski Club may sign up for a trip. Children under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian on the trip. A trip application for a child under the age of 19 must be signed by a parent or guardian of the child.
- 5) By signing up for a trip a member agrees to pay the Club the full cost of the trip applied for, subject to the provisions for timely cancellation in item 7). Each trip will have its own trip deposit and payment schedule to be set by the trip committee. A deposit is required to sign up for a trip. Failure to meet the payment schedule may result in automatic cancellation from the trip subject to the cancellation fee in item 7).
- 6) When a trip is full the trip captain will start a waiting list. To be placed on the waiting list a member must fill out and sign a trip application and pay the standard deposit for that trip. Waiting list members must meet the payment schedules when moving to the confirmed lists.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS

- 7) Unless otherwise listed in individual trip information, cancellations prior to 60 days before the trip departs will result in a cancellation fee of \$50.00; cancellations less than 60 days before the trip departs will result in a cancellation fee of \$100.00 if the trip goes full, or liability for the full cost of the trip if the trip does not go full. Any cancellation fees or penalties may first be deducted from payments the member made for the trip.
- 8) Transferring from the waiting list on one trip to a confirmed list on another trip will be done with no cancellation fee. Refusal to move from the waiting list to the confirmed list will constitute automatic cancellation subject to the cancellation fee in item 7) above.
- 9) If a trip is cancelled by the club, all money paid to the club by a member for that trip will be refunded.
- 10) All members on the waiting list when the trip departs will receive a full refund.
- 11) No refunds will be made until after the trip returns.

BUS TRIPS

- 12) Smoking on buses is prohibited.
- 13) Any time the bus stops en route to its destination, passengers leaving the bus will do so at their own risk.
