

Don Hammel



It is with great pride that we remember the life of Omaha Ski Club past president and life member Don Hammel. Don was heavily involved with the Omaha Ski Club in the 1950's through the 1970's. After giving up his positions on the OSC board, he would still make most of the Club events until his later years. Don and his wife Ruth attended many of the Club's early trips in the sleeper-bus era.

Don was involved in two of the most significant events in Omaha Ski Club history. Don and his ski club buddy, Bill Jacobus, got tired of the Club's short rope-tow ski hill in Omaha's Hummel Park. They spent an entire weekend scouting the Missouri River bluffs for something better. They found a much larger hill north of Crescent, Iowa and convinced the farmer who owned it to let the Omaha Ski Club relocate its ski hill there. As Paul Harvey would say: Now you know the rest of the story. Also, in the 1960's the Omaha Ski Club sub-leased the Dallas-Fort Worth Ski Club bus for a ski trip to Colorado. The bus was customized by the DFW club to convert bus seats into bunk-beds. Don sent the blue-prints of that bus to Doyle Busskohl, owner of Arrow Stage Lines in Norfolk, NE, and they started converting their entire bus fleet to sleeper-buses in the winter to support the 30+ annual ski trips of the Omaha Ski Club.

After giving up his downhill skis, Don started doing weekend cross-country ski trips up to Minnesota. His love for jazz music took him everywhere in Omaha where they played jazz. He never played a musical instrument, but he could sure listen to jazz.

The Omaha Ski club will miss this Omaha Ski Club pioneer and life member.

Hammel, Donald H. Jul 22, 1925 - Jun 11, 2016 Don Hammel was born on July 22, 1925 in Lyons, NE and died on June 11, 2016 in Lincoln. Formerly of Omaha/Ralston, Don was a jazz lover, retired realtor, Korean War veteran, and former president of Omaha Ski Club. Preceded in death by wife, Ruth. Survived by daughter, PK Hammel of Madison, Wisconsin; sons, Paul (Nancy) of Lincoln, NE and Bill (Elise) of Anchorage, AK; six grandchildren. Volunteer Opportunities for Skiers

I had a great opportunity to attend the Outlook Nebraska, Inc. ONI Visually Impaired Community Resources Fair that was held at the Westroads shopping center this year. This was the first event like this to make the public more aware of all the resources that our community has available to the blind and visually impaired. I was surprised at some of the new inventions that are available. One brochure caught my attention because it had snow and skis on the cover! I learned about a program that provides skiers, such as we have in our area, a great volunteer opportunity to share our talents and enthusiasm with others!

Every year, the Black Hills Regional Ski for Light (BHSFL) holds a week-long event at Terry Peak for blind, visually impaired and physically challenged individuals. The week-long program provides a break from the constant attention of dealing with blindness or mobility problems while the program also builds confidence and the wonderful feeling of independence that is often lost to the blind and physically challenged as they meet the challenges in their lives. With the help of people like Ward and Kathy Kinney of Fontenelle tours and Arrow Stage Lines, the participants of the program work together each year to raise money to provide round trip bus travel from Omaha to Deadwood and back at an extremely reasonable price. The bus will make stops across Nebraska to pick up interested participants. Travel on the bus is not limited to Nebraskans. Arrangements would be made through Fontenelle Tours.

The event is a week-long event each January that offers lodging, meals, entertainment, all ski equipment, lift tickets, sleds, snowmobiles, all in-city transportation and a banquet ticket for each participant at the cost of \$200 for the week (not including bus transportation). Financial aid may be available to qualified individuals to reduce the cost to \$100 for the event, but does not pertain to the bus transportation. Fundraising has been able to considerably offset the cost of the bus. Many participants from past events comment that it is great fun and very addicting!

The event takes place the last full week of January every year. This year's event is January 21-27, 2017. It is a great opportunity to volunteer to be a ski guide for a blind skier or assist as a volunteer in other ways during the week. Unfortunately, this is the same week that FSA holds their event.
